Eligibility

In order to qualify to become a student election judge, you will need the following:

- Be a resident of the City of Aurora, or the counties of Kane, Kendall, or Will.
- Be a citizen of the United States.
- Be a junior or senior in high school.
- Have approval from your school's principal.
- Have written permission from your parent or legal guardian.
- Be in good academic standing, with at least a 3.0 GPA on a 4.0 scale.
- Have an interest in the political process.
- Have the ability to read, write, and speak English.
- Possess good character, etiquette, and mannerisms.

Please Read Before Signing

This is a one-time only application for the Student Election Judge Program. You will be responsible for transportation to and from your polling place. Your assigned polling place can and will be different from that of yourself or your parents. Be sure to bring a meal with: it will be a long day. Election judges cannot leave their polling place until their duties are complete. If you do not complete your assigned duties, your payment will be prorated. If you are unable to serve, you must notify our office in writing, via email, or by phone. Submission of this application does not guarantee placement. Spaces are filled on a first-come, first-serve basis so it is in your interest to submit your application quickly.

Duties

BEFORE ELECTION DAY You must attend a mandatory training session. We will announce training session dates via mail.

ON ELECTION DAY Polls are open between **6AM** and **7PM**. As an election judge your duties will begin at 5:00AM and end after 7PM when the ballots have been counted. Election judges are entrusted with protecting the integrity of the election process.

You will:

- Protect the secrecy of votes cast.
- Allow only one vote per voter.
- Assure only qualified voters cast their vote.
- Assume responsibility of all election materials.
- Assist voters with understanding instructions, and those needing additional accommodations such as illiteracy or physical disability.
